On the Kempbridge campus the old music cottage has been demolished and two demountable classrooms moved to Yatama to relocate Year 5 and make way for our new classrooms where I am exceptionally pleased to be able to have Grades 5 & 6 on the same campus.

Whilst all of this work took place, Yatama Campus ground floor received a much needed renovation where we re-painted the hallways and two classrooms and restored the original floors.

The difference has been amazing and much overdue and really has made a feature of all of the Science as Art Murals!

The next step for Yatama is to address the lighting in the corridors and look to if we can move forward to paint the second floor and remaining classrooms.
