Futsal Success

Futsal School Championships!

On Tuesday our senior boys and senior girls futsal teams travelled to Penrith to compete in the 2016 State School Futsal Championships which they had qualified for earlier in the year.

The senior boys team found themselves in a very tough pool and it was quickly evident that there would be no easy games for them. The boys came out all guns blazing and threw everything they had into all 5 pool games. It was an incredibly tight competition but the boys remained positive and played by far their best futsal of the year. Their team orientated approach led to great results which in turn saw them advance from the pool rounds into the quarter finals.

Their quarter final game was an epic battle. After looking the stronger of the two teams a cruel deflection saw the opposition take an early 1-0 lead. Seaforth continued to play some beautiful futsal and clawed back to level the score at 1-1. We then had a scintillating goal disallowed by the referee and the game ended up 1-1 at full time. Into extra time we go.....but still the teams cannot be split.....we move on to the dreaded penalty shoot-out. Our goalkeeper Toby Priestman did a phenomenal job in goals, saving an incredible 3 penalty shots from the other team. But unfortunately it just wasn't our day and our progress in the championship is ended when we narrowly lose the penalty shoot-out.

A very tough way to bow out but the boys could not have tried harder and finishing as one of the top 8 teams in the State is something they should be very proud of. The senior boys squad was Saxon Hillyer, Yannis Frerck, Hugo Thornsby, Joshua Wilde, Rocco Doorbar-Baptist, Fraser Thomson, Thomas Moeliker, Toby Priestman, Harry Maher. Coach: Stuart Baptist.

The senior girls team went into the State Championships having won every game they have played so far this year. However, they ended up in the toughest pool of the State Championships and suffered their first loss of the year during the pool stage of the competition. The girls went through all of their other pool games undefeated and progressed to the quarter finals stage of the competition. In the quarter finals they outplayed St. Spyridon Junior College 4-1 and they then demolished The Illawarra Grammar School 5-0 in the semi-



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final. This meant the girls had qualified for the grand-final against one of the powerhouses of school futsal, Mamre Anglican College (MAS). MAS have won the girls state titles on many occasions and this particular team was a physically intimidating team. On paper MAS were well and truly the favourites to wipe us off the court.

The Seaforth girls were on a roll however and they would not be intimidated. They kept calm heads, fought like tigers, and continued to play the team orientated futsal they have done so well all year. The first half ended 0-0 but early into the second half MAS scored a great long range goal. Down 1-0. On the sideline we wondered whether this would pass all the momentum to MAS and our girls might lose the wind from their sails. No way. The girls kept level heads, trusted themselves, trusted each other (most importantly) and fought back in the last 4 minutes to firstly level at 1-1 and then go ahead 2-1 with only about 30 seconds to go. When the full time whistle blew the girls went wild in celebrations as they realised they had just won the NSW State Championships. They were the best schoolgirls futsal team in the whole of NSW.....not a bad effort for a little school on Sydney's northern beaches!! 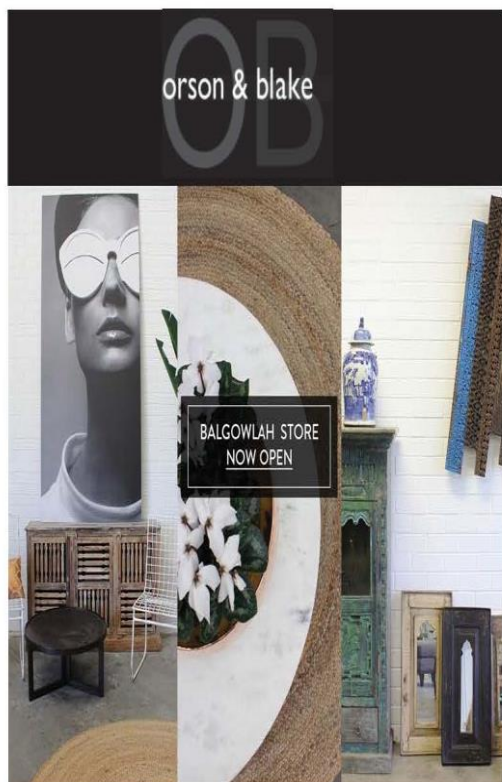

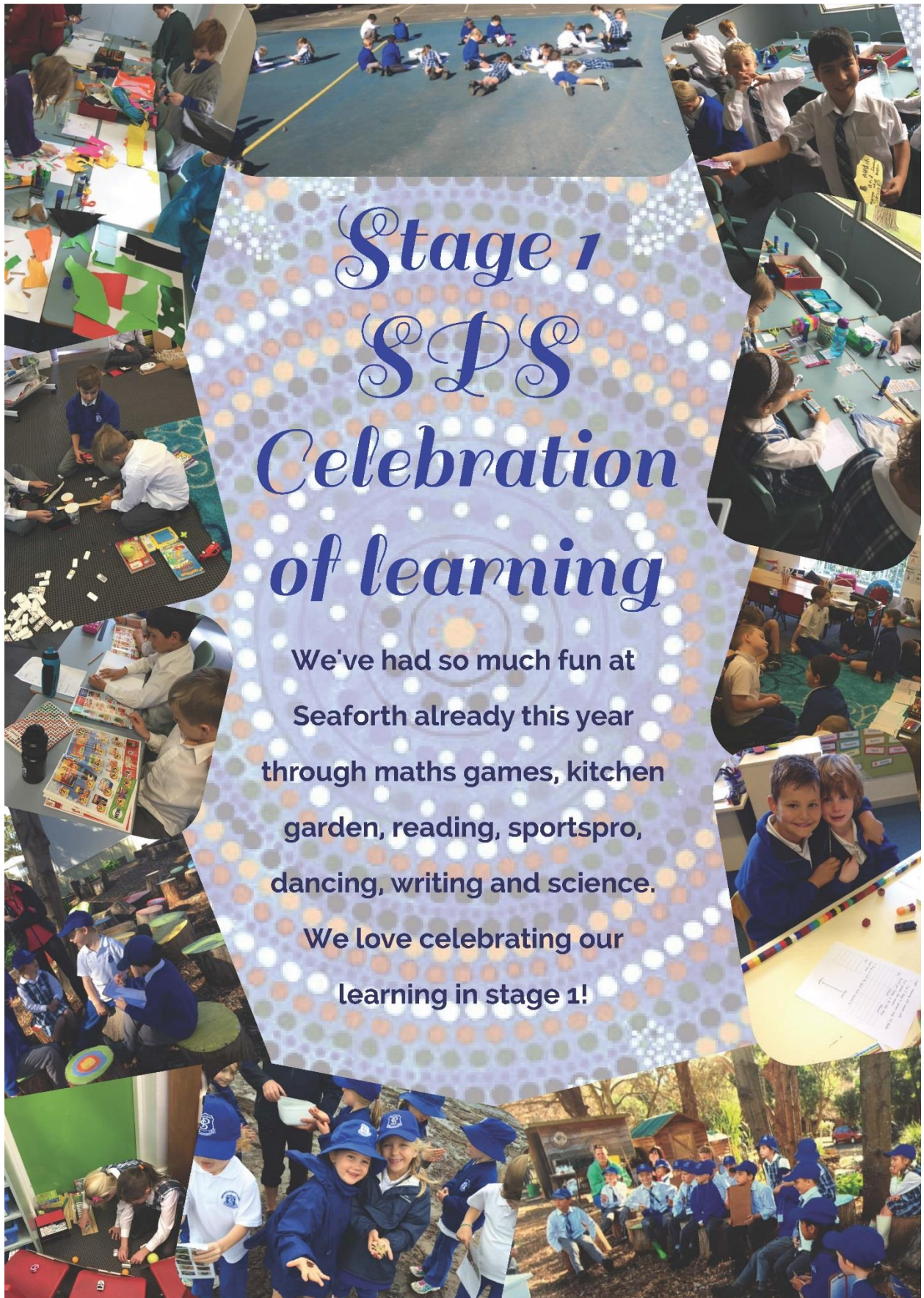

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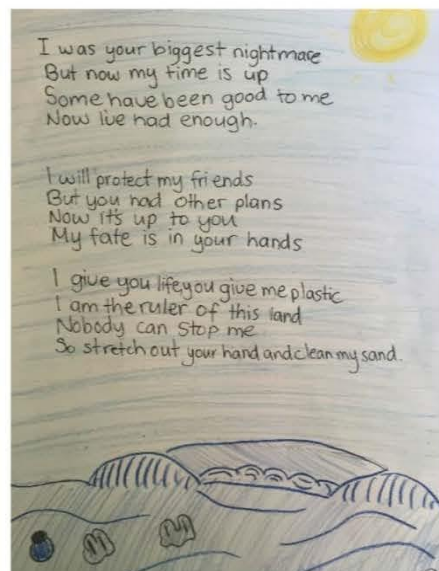

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Stewart House

It is the first time in 10 years that I have had to write to principals, at this time of the year, to seek support for Stewart House fundraising.

We are some \$60,000 year to date behind in projections for school donations through sale of merchandise and general fundraising.

If we do not arrest the trend, it will only get worse by the end of the year.

In part, this has eventuated from unforeseen difficulties in the distribution of marketing materials at the start of this school year.

While Stewart House is recognised as NSW Public Education's 'Charity of Choice' and we are seeing unprecedented support from staff through the Salary Contribution Scheme, we have noticed a declining trend in school donations.

I appreciate that there are many worthy causes competing for the limited resources of your school community but we rely heavily on financial support from public schools to effectively care for the 1,800 public school children who attend our safe haven next to Curl Curl beach at no cost to their parents or carers.

Donations are used to provide children during a 12-day stay with dental, optical, hearing and medical screening and treatment.

Children participate in educational programs and excursions designed to develop their social and emotional skills,

build self-esteem and improve their overall well-being. This experience provides children with a much needed break from their current circumstance.

Our children are inspired to see beyond the present and to have real hope and positive aspirations for their future.

Children in the care of Stewart House attend a specific purpose school onsite for 9 days of their 12-day stay. The NSW Department of Education provides infrastructure and staffing support for this school. All other costs associated with the children's stay are met from charitable contributions. Once the children leave school for the day they are cared for by suitably qualified Stewart House employees overnight and at the weekend. Meals, accommodation costs, transport and entertainment expenses as well as salary costs for supervisors, cooks, cleaners, laundry and maintenance staff are all sourced from donations made to Stewart House.

Thank you for your attention to this e-mail and considering Stewart House as a charity worthy of your support.
