BEFORE AND AFTER SCHOOL CARE (OOSH)

Kitchen Garden News

This term each year groups in the kitchen has a different curriculum that we are focusing on.

Year 3 have had their second lesson and have been working well reading recipes as a group, allocating different tasks for each member of their group. We are establishing good routines and they have particularly enjoyed the hands on practical work. Thank you to the wonderful volunteers who are supporting these classes. It truly is valuable in helping the classes work safely and be more productive as well as the lovely community atmosphere that is developing. This weeks' recipe was spinach and herb pastries. This will be available on the school facebook page. Kitchen classes will be making links to the sustainability work that year 3 have been learning about it this year

Year 5 have been exploring Marvelous Micro-organisms in Science. To compliment this, in kitchen classes we completed sensory evaluations of bread produced with and without yeast, identify characteristics of each bread. We will now further investigate yeast by making bread (in particular Focaccia, which will be flavored with herbs from the garden) as well as working in groups to produce a flow chart on the bread making process.

In Science, year 6 have begun a unit of work on packaging so kitchen classes will explore food packaging by reading labels and in particular taking note sugar content. This also links to nutritional aspects and we will use "That Sugar Film" school resource to investigate sugar and ways we can alter the amount and kinds of sugar we consume. Recipes will aim to introduce students to healthy snack foods that can be easily made at home.

As you are probably already aware, we have welcomed Kieran and Angela to our SOSHC Team in the past couple of months. Under Commonwealth Government Law the allocation of childcare places must be made according to Priority of Access guidelines. Our places are limited by the allocation of Childcare Benefit (CCB) approval and space available to us, so it is important that we have accurate and current booking information for each family. Unfortunately, this year we must ask you to complete a new enrolment form for every child since we have made changes to our form to meet Regulatory requirements.

To secure your bookings for term 1 2017 please complete the Enrolment and Booking form and return to the Centre no later than 26th August 2016. As an existing enrolment, you have priority until that date.

It is National Science Week, so there will be a strong focus on Science activities this week, with craft, experiments and even sports activities in the hall having a science focus.

Our September/October Vacation Care program will be released next week, so make sure you keep an eye out for it. It will be emailed to you and we will have hard copies in the centre. When filling out the form, ensure your child's name is clearly labelled and you have signed everywhere asked.

Lastly, Seaforth OSHC won Team of the Term for Term 3 2016! We were up against 35 other Primary OSHCare Centres. We also had an individual victory, with Ali winning the Resilience Award for keeping a smile in the face of adversity, with all of the recent floods we have had at SOSHC.
