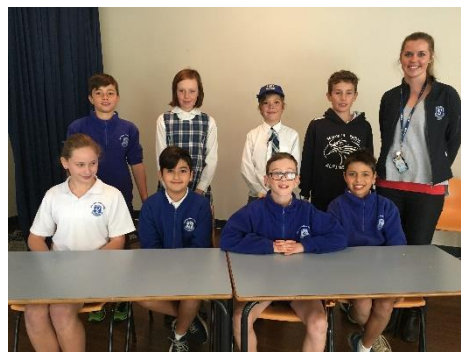

North Head Visit

On Friday 26 May, Ms Alcorn and I attended a commemoration service at North Head to mark the 75th Anniversary of the Japanese submarine attack on Sydney Harbour. We attended the service with our 2 school captains, Eliot and Alice and our two vice captains, Shay and Sam. We heard from a number of distinguished guests and learnt a lot about the attack on Sydney Harbour that happened late on the night of 31 May 1942.



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Below is a short recount by our captains:

We attended North Head on the 26th of May to commemorate the 75th Anniversary of the Japanese midget submarine attack on Sydney Harbour. It was a very special ceremony and the Australian Chief of Defence attended the ceremony. Alice and I and everyone else attending the ceremony laid a wreath on the memorial stone.



A number of different schools around the Northern Beaches attended the ceremony. This also included high schools like Mackellar Girls and Mosman High. War veterans also were present at the commemoration. After the ceremony, Mackellar Girls kindly provided morning tea for all attending.

Reminder about Student Leave for Class Rolls

A timely reminder about leave for our students as many of our families are taking leave for holidays or for family reasons.

An Application for Extended Leave – Travel should be completed by the parent and provided to the principal in cases of extended absence due to travel with family such as family holiday. Leave is included as absence for statistical purposes.

Under the Department of Education, all parents are required to explain the absences of their children from school promptly and within seven days to the school. An explanation for absence must be provided to the school within 7 days of the first day of any period of absence.

Visible Learning Professional Development

As part of our teacher professional development this term, staff have been reflecting and evaluating the results from data collected in Term 1 around Visible Learning. Staff brainstormed what it means to be a successful learner at Seaforth Public School. We discussed the dispositions we want to foster in our students to help them be successful, not just in school but also for later in life. From these afternoons, we collectively wrote our vision that will guide our year ahead of professional development and teaching and learning in the classroom.

All students at Seaforth Public School are committed, resilient learners who articulate what they are learning and why and how they are going to achieve their goal. They use feedback to describe their next steps.

From this vision, yesterday teachers worked collaboratively to create rich learning experiences for our students, teaching the explicit skills and dispositions of what it means to be a successful learner at Seaforth Public School.

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
