#### **NAPLAN Online**

In Week 6 (Monday 21 August - Friday 25 August) students in Year 3 and Year 5 are participating in a trial of the NAPLAN Online software in preparation for replacing the paper test in 2018 or 2019, depending how this statewide trial goes. As this is a trial of the software functionality and the schools' capacity to manage this exam no results will be recorded for our students. The Year 3 students will only be participating in one exam; the combined reading, language conventions and numeracy exam. The Year 5 students are participating in two exams; the combined exam and the writing exam. We are timetabling the trial to minimise disruption to regular classes.

## **Kitchen Garden News**

New classes have settled in well into the Semester 2 Kitchen Garden Program. Mrs Huntington is the Gardening Teacher on Tuesdays & Thursdays. Mrs Forbes is the Cooking Teacher on Wednesdays & Thursdays.

### In the Garden

- Buddy classes have continued being trialled. This semester we have Kindergarten and Year 5/6 coming together to their lessons.
- Year 2 and those Year 1 classes who did not come in Semester 1 are also having their lessons.
- We have harvested bumper crop of chinese cabbages, lettuces, spring onions and broccoli. In coming weeks we should also be harvesting leeks, kale and cauliflowers.
- In recent weeks we have planted garlic, potatoes, kale and more spring onions. We are even hoping to have mushrooms growing - well fingers crossed.
- This semester we are continuing to investigate our native stingless bees and as well as the life cycles found in the kitchen garden.
- And of course the benefits of reducing rubbish and composting is always a constant theme.

### In the Kitchen

- Great start with the seven year 3 & 4 classes.
- Students had the wonderful experience of using in the kitchen, what they had grown and looked after in the garden, last semester.



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- They have learned how to be safe and stay safe in the kitchen, picking up a few kitchen tricks and tips on the way.
- We have made frittatas, risotto, bliss balls, asian noodle salsa and corn chips.
- So far students comments were -"Amazing taste", "delicious, "more please".
- This term we will continue with learning knife skills, explore seasonal fruit and vegetables and how to stay safe in the kitchen.
- We will also continue to practice maths skills such as measuring, doubling, halving and fractions.
- Kitchen classes are a fantastic opportunity to also further develop, teamwork and leadership skills, forward thinking and resilience in our students.

The game was of an incredibly high standard and whilst Seaforth scored a goal in the first minute of play, they soon found themselves behind 4-1. Our girls showed extraordinary focus and composure and before long the momentum started to shift back to Seaforth PS. With about 6 minutes to go they scored to make it 2-4. Not long after they score again to make it 3-4. By now our girls were well on top and with 2 minutes to go they scored again to even the match at 4-4. The final 2 minutes were very tense but neither team managed to break the deadlock which meant the game went into golden goal extra time. At the end of extra time the game was still locked at 4-4. Penalty shoot-out time !! Our goalkeeper, Roxy B, made a wonderful save to deny the first penalty kick. Shay, Alice and Emily then calmly slotted their penalty attempts under huge pressure, meaning Seaforth won 7-6!! What an epic match....



The girls then went on to the grand-final which they won comfortably 3-1 to be crowned State Champions and defend the crown they had won in 2016!! Congratulations girls!! The team was made up of Shay H, Alice T, Roxy B, Alara A, Eloise C and Emily D.
