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They will be sharing their music, dance and culture with the students as part of our NAIDOC week celebrations. In class, students have already been exploring how culture and tradition are passed on through singing, dancing and childhood games. We are looking forward to experiencing this colourful live performance.

I would like to thank Mr Peskett for the hard work he has put into the garden program this year and we are very happy that he will still remain a member of the Seaforth staff. Ms Rachel Kernaghan (who has worked in the garden in previous years) will be teaching in the garden next term along with Mr Smith as a job share. In Term 4 we have secured a highly skilled teacher who is not available until Term 4 but is worth the wait! She has a BSc (Land Management) and BEd K-6 (Environmental Education and Special Education). She is very passionate about the garden program and knows Rachel which will ensure a smooth transition. She can also continue in the role in 2019. At present I am not publishing her name to allow her time to personally communicate with the students and their parents at the school she is currently working in throughout Term 3.

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## From the Deputy Principal

### Coming soon... Seaforth PS Read-a-thon

In Term 3, our school will be running a Read-a-thon from Friday 3 August until Monday 20 August. Read-a-thons are a fantastic way to reinforce good reading habits in our school while raising funds to support literacy within the school. The money raised will be utilised for purchasing teacher resources, reading resources and technology such as Ipads and laptops K-6 to support our students learning.



Read-a-thons are a short period of time when we read as much as we can to raise money. You are able to sponsor students in K-2 on how many books they read in this time; Years 3-6 for how many books or chapters of books they read in this time. The sponsorship can be made on a performance base i.e. an amount for each book read i.e. 50c per book. Alternatively, it could be a pledge of a fixed amount i.e. \$15 for the effort shown for the duration of the Read-a-thon.

Students will be provided with a Sponsor Sheet & payment envelope prior to the school holidays.

### Prizes

Please keep an eye out for students mid-year reports which are coming home next Wednesday 4 July. Students will take these home with them, unless special arrangements have been made with the office. You will notice the report format has changed as we are using a new reporting package. The staff have worked hard to make the reports more user friendly and easy to read. The purpose of school reporting is to inform parents and students of where they are currently achieving according to the indicators of learning outlined by the Department of Education syllabi. They are a reflection of students learning along a continuum and have been rigorously assessed and devised by our dedicated teaching staff. The report now reflects a student's knowledge, understanding and skill in explicit areas of learning. Please feel free to make an appointment to see your child's teacher if you wish to discuss their report and contact the school office if you would like a statistical breakdown of achievement levels across their grade. It is important to remember that a 'sound' grade is recognition that your child has achieved the indicator described.

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## **School Student Transport Scheme (SSTS)**

The School Student Transport Scheme (SSTS) provides eligible school students with free or subsidised travel from home to school.

### **The scheme includes:**

Free travel to and from home and school on approved train, bus, ferry and light rail services during school term.

Students with a disability who are unable to travel to and from school under the School Student Transport Scheme may be eligible for assistance under the Department of Education Assisted School Travel Program.



### **Who can Apply?**

To be eligible for a school Opal card, students may need to live a minimum distance from their school:

**Years K-2** – there is no minimum distance

**Years 3-6** – 1.6km straight line distance or 2.3km walking

**Please Note – the School Opal card is only for travel to and from school.**
