Ready-Set-Read!!! – Read-a-thon starts Friday 3 August



The Read-a-thon starts this Friday 3 August until Monday 20 August. It's not too late to get your sponsors locked in. The office at both campus will have spare sponsor sheets and reading logs.

Purpose: Read-a-thons are a fantastic way to reinforce good reading habits in our school while raising funds to support literacy within the school. Money raised will be utilised for purchasing teacher resources, reading resources and technology such as Ipads and laptops K-6.



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We are very fortunate to have been donated some excellent prizes for our Read-a-thon.

The winners will be announced and distributed on Wednesday 12 September (Week 8) at a special K-6 assembly.

Each child can only win 1 prize. Therefore the overall prize winner will not also receive their class top money prize, that will go to the second place person in that class.

The student who raises the most money will be able to choose whether they want the top prize – the Play Station 4, or one of the other major prizes... the Bluetooth speaker or the Boogie board. Then the second place winner decides from the remaining 2 choices and the third place winner receives the final major prize.

The person who raises the highest amount of money in each class will have their names put in a raffle and will be able to come and choose from the range of 'Experience Prizes' as their names are drawn. No Bake Playdough Recipe



Equipment

- Measuring cup
- Tablespoon
- Large mixing bowl
- Hand mixer



Ingredients

- 2 cups plain flour
- 4tbs Cream of tartar
- 2tbs Cooking oil
- 1 cup Salt
- Food colouring
- 2 cups Boiling water (CAREFUL HOT!)

What to do

- > Put flour, cream of tartar, cooking oil and salt in a mixing bowl
- > Make a well in the middle and slowly pour in the boiling water
- > Add as much or as little food colouring as you like
- > Mix
 - ◊ It might not come together at first, but persevere! It will eventually take on that nice play doughy texture
- > Wrap play dough in cling foil

Beginning of the Day

Arrive at school 8:45am
Buses will take you to Narrabeen Sports Academy at 9:10am

Make sure you have a hat, sunscreen, wet weather jacket, water, food and wet weather gear. The canteen will be open at Narrabeen Sports Academy. Please don't rely on this as it will be a very very busy day.



At the Athletic Carnival

Everyone will sit under the shade cloth in your houses.

Listen to **Miss Carlton** as she will be on the microphone and will tell you where to go.

For example, she will call your race, '7 and 8yrs boys and girls in the 100m to the marshaling area'. You will go to the marshaling area when you hear your race being called.

You will get shown the marshaling area as well as other areas on the day.

Mrs Reid and Miss Aitken will be at the marshaling area.

You're Up! Time to Run!

When it is your turn run. Mrs Reid and Miss Aitken will place in you in a lane.

STAY IN THAT LANE. Don't swap lanes. If you go into someone else's lane you could get disqualified.

Miss Piper will blow a whistle and you will walk to the line, she will say 'get set', you will get reading to run, then a beep sound, and you're off! (Don't worry if you are confused right now, we will show you on the day)

When you finish your race **STAY IN YOUR LANE-DON'T GET OUT** until all the runners have finished.

Main thing to remember: **STAY IN YOUR LANE AND LISTEN TO THE TEACHERS!**

Competitive students who are competing at these events you will need to listen to Miss Carlton on the microphone.

EVEN if you come 1st in your age group this might not mean you get to go to zone. It is top 2 from Juniors (from 8, 9 and 10's), top 2 from 11 and 12 year olds.

There is no set 'lunch time or recess time' for everyone at once. Each age group will have one allocated eating time. When you are in the stands you can eat and relax.

Make sure you **DRINK** throughout the day because you will be doing a lot of activities!
