### **Planning for 2019**

### **Changes to Uniform Policy from the Department of Education**

The NSW Department of Education has revised the School Uniform Policy and associated guidelines following an extensive review and consultation process, including with the NSW Parents and Citizens Association. The revised School Uniform Policy requirements include that:

- all students have the opportunity to access the full range of school activities, including physical activities while wearing a school uniform
- girls must have the option to wear shorts and pants
- consideration is given to cost and how to assist families, including for schools to inform parents how they can access financial support to purchase school uniform items.

Where changes are required to a school's uniform, there must be formal consultation with students, teachers and other staff, parents or carers, and the school community (including the Parents and Citizens' Association). Parents and carers should be given up to 3 years to comply with any changes.

### **Optional Information:**

Our school expects students to wear their uniform during school hours, while travelling to and from school and when engaged in school activities out of school hours. Our P&C have plans in place already for designing new items of clothing that will become available later in the year to comply with the policy. The next P&C meeting is on Tuesday 21 August.

We hope that you can attend the P&C meeting to support our school in ensuring we meet the requirements of the revised School Uniform Policy. When all students wear our school uniform their personal safety is enhanced and a sense of belonging to our school community is created. A positive school identity is also promoted in our local community.

### **SEAFORTH PUBLIC SCHOOL – Online NAPLAN School Readiness test – Monday 20 August – Thursday 23 August**

Students in Year 3 & 5 will be trialling the new Online NAPLAN tool issued by the NSW Board of Studies between Monday 20 August – Thursday 23 August. This is a trial ONLY and there will not be any access to student results following the trial.

**Could all Year 3 & 5 students please bring in headphones to plug into their laptops for the tests.**

Please see the information below from the NAPLAN website:

**NAPLAN is moving online. This means moving NAPLAN from the current paper-based tests to computer-based assessments. The transition to NAPLAN online will commence from 2018.**

In May of every year, students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 take part in the National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN). NAPLAN was first introduced in 2008 and has become a routine part of the school calendar in Australia.



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NAPLAN, which is a part of the National Assessment Program (NAP), is how governments, education authorities and schools can determine whether young Australians are reaching important educational goals.

States and territories determine when their schools commence NAPLAN Online.

Moving NAPLAN online brings many new opportunities for students and teachers that are limited or not possible with paper-based tests.

## The benefits of online assessments

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Some of the main benefits of students taking part in NAPLAN Online include:

- **Better assessment – and more precise results.** NAPLAN Online uses a tailored test or adaptive design, where the test automatically adapts to a student's performance and asks questions that match the student achievement level, allowing the student to demonstrate their knowledge. This provides teachers and schools with more targeted and detailed information on students' performance on the tests. Tailored testing also provides an opportunity to broaden the scope of the assessments.
- **Faster turnaround of results.** Delivery of assessments online significantly reduces the time it takes to provide feedback to schools, students and parents, so teachers can respond more quickly to learning needs.
- **More engaging.** ACARA research into online assessment has shown that students have engaged well with electronic tests.

As technology develops, ACARA aims to further refine the delivery of the tests to best use the available technology to provide increasingly sophisticated assessments and valuable feedback to teachers, parents and education authorities.

## NAPLAN Online: key messages

- NAPLAN helps parents, carers and educators to see if children are meeting important numeracy and literacy standards. It is used to support school improvement processes by enabling teachers to monitor their students' progress over time and to identify areas of strength and development.
- NAPLAN provides parents and carers with an individual report, showing their child's results and a national comparison of their child's performance against other Australian students in their year level.
- NAPLAN Online will provide better assessment, more precise results and faster turnaround of information.
- NAPLAN Online will use 'tailored testing', which gives students questions better suited to their ability, resulting in better assessment and more precise results.
- The precision and improved timing of the results will help teachers tailor their teaching more specifically to student needs.
- An online national assessment platform has been developed by Education Services Australia with funds from the Australian Government.
- Significant planning, development, research and trialling have been ongoing since 2012 to support the move to NAPLAN Online.
- State/territory education authorities will determine the timing of their move to NAPLAN Online and lead implementation for their state/territory.

## Stage 2 History Excursion – The Rocks

This week, Stage 2 have been venturing into the city to explore The Rocks and its rich history.

Some of the most interesting things we learnt:

- The Aboriginal name for The Rocks is Tallawoladah
- The main reason this area was chosen to settle in was due to the fresh water stream which is now situated under a big green glass building
- The Cabbage tree palms used to be used for building houses
- The basements were lit by the use of glass panes on the roads
- Aboriginal people called their boats 'yowies'



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- When the convicts were in the boats, the weight of the people kept the boats balanced. Once the convicts stopped coming in the 1800s, they used rocks to balance the boats. These rocks were then used to make roads and pavements.
- In the 1800s, the sea wall was a semicircular shape, hence how Circular Quay got its name. The wall has been added to and is no longer a circular shape.
- British settlers did not think the land was owned by anyone because Aboriginal people had no fences or visual claims to the land
- According to Aboriginal people, Sydney Cove was called Warrane
- Aboriginal communities and British settlers began to pick up words from each other's languages
- More than 125 000 pennies arrived in Sydney in 1799
- Young boys used to have to pick up the horse droppings to make sure the streets were clean so the ladies' gowns didn't get dirty
- The shops were labelled with numbers because most people were illiterate
- Workers used palm fronds to make hats to protect themselves from the harsh Australian heat

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<b>Greek Salad</b> <b>Ingredients</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• 3 tomatoes (diced)</li> <li>• 1 Cucumber (diced)</li> <li>• 1 tsp salt</li> <li>• 125ml olive oil</li> <li>• ½ lettuce</li> <li>• 1 red onion (thinly sliced)</li> <li>• 1 red capsicum (diced)</li> <li>• 2 tbsp olives</li> <li>• ½ pack feta cheese (crumbled or diced)</li> <li>• 60ml white vinegar</li> <li>• 1tsp oregano</li> </ul> <b>Method</b> Combine tomatoes, cucumber, onion, capsicum, olives feta and lettuce in large bowl. (Sprinkle with oregano) Whisk oil, salt and vinegar in separate bowl. Just before eating pour sauce over salad	<b>Vietnamese Rice Paper Rolls</b> <b>Ingredients</b> 100g vermicelli noodles Coriander 2 grated carrots Mint leaves Rice paper ½ grated cucumber ¼ grated cabbage <b>Method</b> Boil water in small pot. Once boiling turn of flame Put noodles in water (use wooden spoon to push noodles into the water) Leave to stand (see pack for time) Drain and rinse noodles using colander Tip noodles into clean tea towel and pat dry Wash and dry vegetables and herbs Peel and grate carrots Grate cucumber Rip mint and coriander leaves into small pieces Shred cabbage Mix all ingredients together  Clean bench Put another clean tea towel on bench Fill large bowl with VERY warm water Put wraps in water for 15-20sec (until soft) Lift wrap onto tea towel and fill with mixture Roll once then fold ends in and continue rolling Place on serving tray Serve with Tamari sauce
