### NAPLAN (National Assessment Program Literacy and Numeracy)

From Tuesday 14 – Thursday 16 May 2019, students at our school in Years 3 & 5, will sit the NAPLAN paper assessments. The schedule for tests is as follows:

On Friday 17 May, a 'catch-up' day is scheduled for students who missed a test.

Students may be exempt from the NAPLAN tests if they:

- are newly arrived in Australia (less than one year before the test) and with a language background other than English, or
- have significant intellectual disability and/or significant co-existing conditions which severely limit their capacity to participate in the tests.

All other students are expected to participate in the tests. Disability adjustments which reflect the student's normal level of support in the classroom may be provided. Large print, braille, coloured paper versions and electronic tests are also available to meet the needs of individual students. Access to disability adjustments or exemption from the tests must be discussed with the school principal and a parent or carer consent form must be signed.

Students may be withdrawn from NAPLAN by their parent or carer after consultation with the school principal. To withdraw your child from NAPLAN, a parent or carer consent form must be signed. Please make an appointment with your child's teacher if you need to discuss your child's participation in NAPLAN.

- addresses the diverse academic and social needs of every student to support them to be successful;
- enables schools to establish a continuum of supports that are intensified to meet student need;
- is team driven, using a problem solving approach that engages the whole school staff, students and parents/carers;
- establishes positive social expectations for all in the school community; and
- provides a framework for the school and its community to collectively support the wellbeing of every student.

It has been successfully running within Seaforth Public School since 2015.

The four expectations at Seaforth are Safe, Respectful, Responsible and Resilient. Each term we focus on a different expectation. This term we are focussing on being Responsible. Each week at Seaforth we have a different setting for the term's expectation. Please see the following expectations.
